Where do the months go. I am amazed that it is May already. We continue to Give God thanks for the way He has kept us. There have been many challenges but also many Blessings. The highlight of our year so far has been the Wedding of one of our boys in April. We were thrilled to get an invitation to the wedding and duly descended in mini bus for the 31/2 hour journey to Nairobi. We were so encouraged and thankful to God for his faithfulness. I was reading some information on Jimmy today and was reminded that he had been in and out of remand homes and been on the street in various towns in Kenya for 7 years before he came to us. The single most important factor in his rehabilitation was him committing his life to Christ. We saw an immediate change in him and his devotion was evident.

Seeing Jimmy has reminded me that the single most important thing we can do is introduce these youngsters to the Risen Christ. Do pray for us as we make this our no 1 goal.

Another highlight of the year is that 3 of our secondary school students have attained grades in their secondary school examination to give them a place at University next year. This is a great achievement for these youngsters and we are really thankful to God.

As the cost of living continues to rise here in Kenya mainly fuelled by high fuel prices we are challenged by more and more request for school fees. We are grateful for your continued partnership with us especially in this area.

We hosted 100+ Children in the recent Easter holidays and sent 3 very proud little boys off to school for the first time last week.

As we continue to develop and grow we want to start regular Saturday morning openings. We want to major on clubs especially a Bible club to give sound Biblical teaching to our youngsters,

Pray that we get this off the ground.

Those of you who prayed for Mumbi and Phillip last year will be interested to hear that they have recently moved homes. Due to issues where they were living it was decided to move them. We are really thankful to Rose and her family for agreeing to take them in. Already we can see them settling and doing well. Mumbi started in a local nursery school this week.

We are looking for people to come and join us in the work here. Is God calling you to give a year or two in his service?

Maybe this is your place.

We hope to see some of you in July while we are in the UK.
